NATIONAL ISSUES

Hospital of the Future' Report Urges Major Changes: A report released in November from The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO) offers guiding principles and actions for the hospital of the future to meet the challenges of older and sicker patients, patient safety and quality of care, economics and the work force. As these challenges escalate, hospitals can lead the effort to meet these demands. *Health Care at the Crossroads: Guiding Principles for the Development of the Hospital of the Future* contends that hospitals must respond in new ways as escalating health care costs are hitting record highs and the conditions and care needs of hospitalized patients are growing more complex. The report is the work of an expert panel comprising hospital executives and clinical leaders, as well as experts in technology, health care economics, hospital design and patient safety. The roundtable analyzed how socio-economic trends, technology, the physical environment of care, patient-centered care values and ongoing staffing challenges will impact the hospital of the future. The report recommends action in five core areas: economic viability, technology adoption, patient-centered care, staffing and hospital design. General Electric Will Spend \$200M to Develop Electronic Systems for Medical Information, Patient Records: General Electric and GE Healthcare officials on have announced plans to partner with several U.S. medical institutions on an effort to develop a national electronic health record system. As part of the five-year, \$200 million effort, GE will partner with the Mayo Clinic, Intermountain Healthcare, the Montefiore Medical Center and the University of California-San Francisco Medical Center. The effort seeks to establish a system that will allow health care providers to share patient medical records electronically to improve efficiency and quality of care and reduce costs. Draft Federal Bill To Link Medicare Payments for Inpatient Hospital Care to Quality: Senate Finance Committee Chair Max Baucus (D-Mont.) and ranking member Chuck Grassley (R-Iowa) have released a draft bill that would link Medicare reimbursement levels for inpatient hospital care to the quality of care, rather than the number of services provided. Under the legislation, the new policy would begin in fiscal year 2012 and take full effect in FY 2016. Medicare reimbursement levels would increase from 1% to 2% during that time. The legislation would base quality standards on a list of measures established by several medical organizations, such as the National Quality Forum. Fraud Imposter Tracking: The NCSBN Disciplinary Resources Advisory Panel defines an imposter as someone claiming to be a nurse who is not authorized to be a nurse. Imposters include the individual who practices as a nurse but is not legally authorized (licensed) to be a

nurse (may have some education but does not meet licensure requirements); instances where a license is fraudulently obtained through use of false credentials; or a person who practicing or attempting to practice by assuming the entire identity of a properly licensed nurse (both practicing without authority and presenting fraudulent credentials). Currently, boards of nursing can send information about imposters to NCSBN in the form of a PDF / word document. NCSBN compiles the information from the Boards and publishes them in the web site for viewing. A new proposal being considered is the Fraudulent Imposter Tracking Tool which will allow boards to track incidents of fraud and nurse imposter through an online portal, sharing the fraudulent documents, searching for individuals practicing or presenting false credentials, and the ability to create a repository on how to identify fake documents; fraudulent schools and organizations; and nurse imposters. Anthony Diggs is participating in the group that is developing the Fraud Imposter Tracking System.

STATE ISSUES

Health Professions Council: HPC continues to work on a data base project which will be incorporated into the LARs of the agencies who need a new, common licensure data base. In addition, as recommended in the Business Process Review by the Office of the Governor, members are exploring the sharing of financial services; a committee has been formed to study the matter.

Fraudulent Nursing Educational Program Update: Informational reports have been provided to Board members since the April 2008 Board meeting regarding the presence of fraudulent nursing educational programs. The Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) has ordered these schools to cease and desist operation and referred the cases to the Office of the Attorney General (OAG) with the request that the OAG file lawsuits to stop operations of the fraudulent nursing programs. Dusty and Virginia Ayars were scheduled to testify at a hearing on November 14, 2008 at the Texas Workforce Commission regarding Omnibus/ORLA Vocational Nursing Program; however, an agreement was reached between ORLA and the TWC on November 13, 2008 and the hearing was cancelled. Also in November, the Board reported A & B Nursing Bridges, an alleged Certified Nursing Assistant to LVN program of study based in Houston, to the TWC for investigation.

The Attorney General continues to pursue actions against alleged fraudulent programs including Career Advanced (CATS Group); Esther Medical (EMII); and Vocational Training Educational Center (VTEC). The nursing education consultants continue to provide information to the public regarding the fraudulent programs through our telephone and email responses, and the Board's website.

BOARD ISSUES

BNE Bulletin Articles: The January issue of the *Board of Nursing Bulletin* is a special edition which features part of the history of the Board of Nurse Examiners and the Board of Vocational Nurse Examiners in recognition of the 100th anniversary of the Board. The April issue will follow up with the second history installment. The January issue also contains articles on the Deborah Bell being elected as the new Vice President and Richard Gibbs being appointed to the NCSBN Commitment to Ongoing Regulatory Excellence (CORE) Committee, and the online jurisprudence prep course.

Board Development: Generally, at each board meeting, a board development session is held. We are currently focusing on disciplinary processes to educate new board members and refresh experienced Board members. At this Board meeting, Legal and Enforcement staff will conduct a mock Eligibility and Disciplinary Committee meeting.

October Board Meeting: Pictures of Board members and staff will be taken to commemorate the 100th anniversary year on Thursday at the Long Center for the Performing Arts.

AGENCY ISSUES

Student Criminal Background Checks Grant: The Board received a \$50,000 grant from the National Council of State Boards of Nursing through a federal grant for licensure portability. The purpose of the grant is to aid in a smooth implementation of Criminal Background Checks (CBCs) for student nurses. The grant is subject to audit and its impact will be monitored by NCSBN. All implementation activities and reports must be completed by August 1, 2009 per federal policy for year two funding. In September, the student criminal background check process began on a voluntary basis. Schools of nursing who are interested in having their students screened before enrollment or clinical experiences may chose to participate in the project. It is anticipated at this time that should this program continue, it will require additional funding in the next biennium and such request was incorporated into the Legislative Appropriations Request for the FY 10-11 biennium. The agency has received approval from the Legislative Budget Board on December 18, 2008 and the Governor's Office on December 19, 2008 to use the grant money to hire two additional staff for this program. Staff: Carol Marshall resigned her position as nursing consultant, effective January 31, 2009. Melinda Hester, former practice nursing consultant for the Board, has been hired as the Team Leader for Practice and will join the staff February 1, 2008. Melinda is a 1979 graduate of the baccalaureate in nursing program at the University of Texas at Houston and a 1985 graduate of the masters in nursing program at the University of Oklahoma. She has worked this past year for the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) in planning, developing, implementing and oversight of the Texas Nurse-Family Partnership, a grantee program. The program is a voluntary prevention program providing nurse home visitation services to low income, first-time mothers. Nurses provide support, education and counseling on health, behavioral and self-sufficiency issues. Melinda has 11 years experience as a school nurse and taught nursing in a community college program. She worked for the Board for 3 years as a

practice consultant. We are very pleased to welcome Melinda back to the agency. She will be at the April board meeting.

As I reported at the October Board meeting, I have considered hiring outside counsel to deal with the backlog of cases that are awaiting setting at SOAH. Although the Board's Legislative Appropriations Request includes an exceptional item for additional staff in enforcement and legal, I am reluctant to wait until September to begin setting cases. I have approved two initiatives including moving an FTE to the legal department which allowed the hiring of two new attorneys and contracting with outside counsel to provide legal services to the agency. I hope that our Legislative Appropriations exceptional item request for additional staff will be approved and we will be able to replace staff positions transferred in FY 09. Our new attorneys are Kyle Hensley and Jenna Abel.

Jenna Abel is a 2002 graduate of the Texas Wesleyan School of Law in Fort Worth, Texas. She began her career as an Associate Attorney of a Colorado firm engaged in a general family, civil and criminal law practice. In October 2005 she began employment at the Texas Department of Insurance where she was promoted in May of 2006 to an Attorney IV position as the Department's Policy Development Counsel. She has general civil and criminal litigation experience and an in depth experience in administrative law and agency rule making procedures.

Kyle Hensley is a 1999 graduate of the University of Texas School of Law. He began his career in Civil Litigation practice with the Texas Office of Attorney General. He worked in the tort litigation section with a brief foray into private practice from April 2000 to June of 2005. Kyle has represented the various state agencies including the State Office of Risk Management and the University of Texas System. With the Office of Attorney General, he first chaired several jury trials to favorable verdict and represented the State before the State Office of Administrative Hearings. Kyle worked in General Litigation in the private sector until August of 2006 when he was employed with the City of Austin as a prosecutor. As prosecutor with the City, Kyle had over 50 jury trials and 100 trials before the court.

Nursing Jurisprudence Examination: The Jurisprudence examination required for initial licensure by Texas Occupations Code Section 301.252, License Application, has been implemented as required by law. Access to the Board's examination is available through the website, <http://www.bon.state.tx.us/olv/je.html> . Those applying for initial licensure by exam or endorsement **after** September 1, 2008 must pass the Jurisprudence Exam in order to be eligible for licensure.
